Grant Enables RCT Technology Upgrades

Rome Community Foundation awarded RCT \$1300 for the purchase and installation of Information Technology Improvements. Under the guidance of Chris and Arnold Galin the grant money was used for upgrading to an automated box office ticketing system. This system will allow customers to purchase tickets online for any of the upcoming performances for the 2015-2016 seasons.

Customers can now visit the theater's website; www.Romecommunitytheater.org to purchase tickets. This new system allows customers to select and reserve seats of their choice from the seating chart online. Once tickets have been purchased, customers will have a choice of either printing their own tickets or they can pick them up at the RCT box office.

Individual show tickets can also be purchased at the box office one half hour before each performance. Reservations can be made by calling the box office at 337-5920 one week prior to each performance. The box office hours are 6 to 10 pm.
