RCT Presents Five One Act Plays

The Evening of One Acts will be presented at RCT Oct. 22 at 7:30PM and Oct. 23 at 2:30PM. Dug Bartell will be directing three David Ives plays; "Words, Words, Words", "Sure Thing" and "The Philadelphia". "Words, Words, Words" recalls the philosophical adage that three monkeys typing into infinity will sooner or later produce Hamlet and asks; What would monkeys talk about at their typewriters? "Sure Thing": Two people meet in a café and find their way through a conversational minefield as an offstage bell interrupts their false starts, gaffes and faux pas on the way to falling in love. "The Philadelphia" presents a young man in a restaurant who has fallen into a "Philadelphia", a Twilight Zone like state in which he cannot get anything he asks for. Eric Amleaf will be directing "Tender Offers" written by Wendy Wasserstein. The play focuses on a distant father and his nine-year-old daughter. When he arrives late to pick her up from dance class, they discuss their lack of communication and why he missed her dance recital. Arnold Galin will be directing "I'm Herbert". "I'm Herbert" is about two old people sitting on a porch in a pair of rocking chairs and talking - of course they don't know how funny they are. Each has had one or more previous relationships but they are hazy as to details. Tickets are on sale at the RCT box office on the day of the performance. General admission is \$10.00.

"Joseph & The Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat"

On Oct. 6-8 and 14-15 (at 7:30PM); and 9&16 (at 2:30PM), RCT presents the first show of its 2016-2017 season-"Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat". The Biblical story of Joseph and his coat of many colors comes to life in Andrew Lloyd Webber's delightful songs with Tim Rice's storytelling lyrics. Joseph, the favorite son of Jacob's dozen offspring, is blessed (or cursed) with accurate dream interpretation and consequently angers his brothers so much they decide to sell him into slavery and brought to Egypt. He works his way up into the good graces of his master, Potiphar, only to be seduced by Potiphar's wife. Although Joseph tries to avoid her clutches, he is caught in a comprising position and Potiphar throws him in jail. While in jail, his dream reading skills become well known; so much so that the Pharaoh needs his services. When the Pharaoh's dreams are proved out, he makes Joseph his number one right hand man. Hard times fall on Jacob's family back in Canaan and they travel to Egypt in search of food. Joseph recognizes them, but they don't know him anymore. Joseph tests their integrity and finds them true and loyal. A family reunion and celebration finishes out the tale. Musical styles include country-western, calypso, pop, rock-n-roll, ballads and more. The show is directed by Barbara Seaton and produced by Brian Angell.
