"Kindertransport", a play by Diane Samuels, is a modern classic about one woman's struggle to come to terms with her past. Brutally separated from her German Jewish parents and brought to England with the promise of a new life, nine-year-old Eva ends up in Manchester. When Eva's parents fail to escape Germany, the child changes her name and begins the process of denial of her roots. It is only when her own daughter discovers some letters in their attic that Eva is forced to confront the truth about the past. Though fictitious, it is based upon many real kinder stories.

Arnold Galin, the director, is pleased to announce his cast. Denise Morganti plays Evelyn, a middle-class woman who is a survivor of the Kindertransport still trying to cope with her past experiences. Melissa Brass plays her daughter Faith, a young woman very interested in her mother's past. New comer, Merissa Marthage portrays the young Evelyn, the central character of the play. It is through this character we begin to understand Evelyn's past. Laura DeFranco plays Helga, Eva's mother. A very complex woman, who has to make life changing decisions. Rounding out the cast is T.J. Phister as Lil, the English foster mother who was responsible for Eva's survival. The production takes place June 5, 6, 7 and 8th.
