Oct. 14-17 Live Theater Returns

RCT will present an Outcast International production of the hilarious farce *Noises Off* by Michael Frayn October 14-16 at 7:30pm and October 17 at 2:30pm.

Called the "funniest play ever written, *Noises Off presents* the madcap misadventures of a touring troupe of English actors, their bitingly sarcastic director, and their overworked stage management crew as they attempt to rehearse and perform a flop of a farce entitled "*Nothing On*". *Noises Off* features a play-within-a-play chaos, preposterous amounts of props, crazy characters, and slamming doors galore.

With director Thom Capozzella at the helm, *Noises Off* will welcome audiences back into the theater with laughter and fun. Eileen Tiller-Clanton, Outcast founder says "with *Noises Off*, we want people to simply laugh together, to join as a community to enjoy good theater that takes us out of the real world for just a little while."

The cast of *Noises Off* includes: Eric Almleaf, Anna Wise, Adrian Maggio, Eileen Tiller-Clanton, Vincent Cavo, Melissa Maggio, Daniel Burgess, Stephanie Mazloom, and Rick Signorelli.

Tickets to *Noises Off* are \$15 and available at the RCT box office beginning one half hour before curtain or at <u>www.outcasttheater.com</u> and www.romecommunitytheater.com. RCT officials say COVID-19 protocol will require masks for all audience members and RCT volunteers who are in the same area as audience members. The performers and all volunteers working backstage have been vaccinated. The play is staged to assure that no on stage actor will be within twelve feet of the front row of the audience.

Outcast International was founded in Munich, Germany in 1996. After offering authentic, English-language entertainment to European audiences, Outcast established itself in Central New York. Outcast also continues to perform overseas, having brought two productions to the Edinburgh Fringe Festival. *Noises Off* is Outcast's 18th US production and its 4th cooperation with the Rome Community Theater.

The production of *Noises Off* will mark RCT's first full length stage production since the COVID-19 pandemic mandated the theatre's closure after their Mar. 2020 production of *The Game's Afoot*.
